#### Dear Parent or Guardian.

Promontory School of Expeditionary Learning has partnered with <u>UtahRadon.org</u> for an excitling hands-on learning project. It will involve our 7th/8th Community and encompasses science, math, language arts, and history. Students have the opportunity to test their own homes for radon levels, and the residences of family and friends who agree to participate. The project will begin in November and run through January.

This project will require some coordination with you.

- For each residence you will be testing, please fill out the form at <u>utahradon.ora/free-test</u> and <u>enter 16</u> in the referral code box. This will help identify the test request as part of the Promontory project and help us collect the data.
- Please select the box that states "I agree to share my home's radon test result and address with Promontory School." This allows us to collect the test results for our project
- 3. The test will arrive in about two business days.
- Please complete the test by November 21st. Follow the instructions that will be included with the test. They will guide you in setting up the test.
- Please return the test 48-72 hours after starting time. A prepaid envelope will be provided.
- You should receive your test results in about a week.

If your student is testing someone else's home, please share these instructions with them.

This is a wonderful expeditionary learning experience for our students. Thank you for your support!




## **Admin Goals**

     feedback surveys for fieldwork, Celebrations of Teaching, Falcon Feathers, staff spotlights
- Shared Leadership & School Culture
  - Twice a week teacher crew meetings, Crew Team Leaders, Progress Team Leaders, parent meeting request form in office, suggestion box near front office, more in-depth coaching support for teachers, PBIS system (Blind Mule), teacher development plans, increase in school events and student/parent participation, service to our community and more community events
- Expeditionary Learning Implementation
  - Expedition Expert aligning expectations and creating structures, presented at PoP general membership meeting, admin observations (walkthroughs, snapshots, Blind Mule/CSC observations, etc.), common formative assessments (CFAs), service learning opportunities, SIP strategies are tied to EL Core Practices
