Box Elder County Sheriff's Deputy Mike Allred and his K-9 partner, Azula, appeared at an assembly at Promontory School of Expeditionary Learning to thank students for letters they sent expressing thanks and support—and for treats for Azula—while he was recuperating after being injured during a domestic violence incident in Tremonton last month where two Tremonton-Garland officers were killed. That challenge has turned into a larger effort, as the school is now challenging local businesses, organizations and agencies to eat their vegetables. Allred's appearance was part of a larger event where the school provided breakfast for local emergency responders and law enforcement.

  - Canvas course for staff




## **School Safety**
