Instructional Support

Math Focus

- Math CFAs are aligned directly to the Utah RISE assessment to ensure rigor and alignment.
- Sonya developed and administered math CFAs with fidelity, ensuring consistency and reliability of data.
- Math CFA results will be reported at a future board meeting as part of ongoing progress monitoring.
- Four RISE practice tests were required of all teachers to strengthen instructional alignment and assessment readiness.
- WIN Time is supporting math growth, with teachers intentionally moving students from Green to Blue through targeted instruction.

Instruction

- The third round of instructional coaching cycles is underway, with our new interim teacher Anjanette Darrington starting January 20th.
- Celebrations of Learning were completed for grades 7–8 on the night of the board meeting.
- Mid-year RISE testing will be completed by the first week of February.
- WIN Time continues to show impact, with increased focus and student movement between performance bands.
- Mid-year Acadience data came in low as expected, as it assesses second-semester standards to intentionally identify gaps.
- Sheri provided targeted RTI training for aides to ensure fidelity of best practices.
- Jesse joined the RTI team, strengthening instructional support.
- The instructional team is refining essential ELA learning targets to strengthen Tier 1 instruction and clarity.

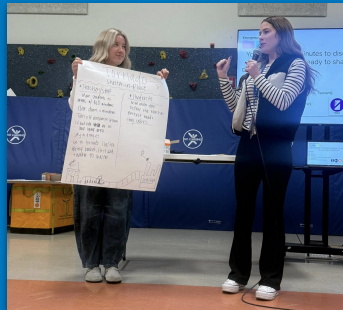
Special Education

- Sped team trainings - Topics covered include:
 - Effective teaching practices, Reading and Math instruction using the Effective Teaching Cycle (I do, We do, You do), data tracking, and fidelity to curriculum and IEPs.
- Progress reports are going out and our students are making progress toward their IEP goals and WIN time has allowed them to more fully participate in Tier 1 instruction.
- The biggest highlight was definitely Mrs. Mahana's Food intensive.
 - Her intensive was a very meaningful expeditionary learning experience for many students with significant behavioral needs. They were extremely successful and she masterfully met each student's unique needs while providing a service-oriented and unique intensive experience.
